The book's interesting setting will be used in the activity, so including setting information in your notes is important. Be sure to take notes on the parts of the plot, the setting, and descriptions of major characters.
- 3. Students will read Among the Hidden and write a book report. A guide on how to organize the book report is included in this document. This book report can by typed. If typed, the report must be double-spaced using Times New Roman, 12 pt.

Among the Hidden Book Report Format:

Summary: Write a summary of the book

1st paragraph- Write about the setting, (where and when the story takes place). Introduce the main character or characters in the story. Ex. What are the character's qualities, name, etc. Discuss what conflict/problem the main character faces in the story. If you're still having trouble starting, you can answer the questions who, what, when, where, and how.

2nd paragraph- Summarize what happens in the rising action up until the climax of the story, (don't give away the ending, this should be just enough to tease the reader into wanting to read this book. Use some of these transition words to help you write your review.

Opinion:

3rd paragraph- Write a paragraph giving your opinion on the book. Use these guidelines. Write about why you like or dislike the book. Give details, for example: Was the book confusing? Was it too easy to read or too hard? Was it predictable/believable? Did you like the ending? What was your favorite part? What connections did you make with your life or other books? Talk about the author's style of writing and give examples from the book. This should be a minimum of five sentences.

Recommendation:

4th paragraph- Explain whether you would recommend this book to student or not? Rate the book from 1 star to 5 stars. Give examples of why you gave it the rating you did. Examples should include a quote or quotes from the book or a summary of the part of the book that you liked or did not like.
